3. Car dealership sells the car to customers.




This creates jobs and incomes in countries around the world.

Services, or help, people can provide you







Service vs. Manufacturing Industry

Service industries produce intangible goods.





• Manufacturing industries produce tangible goods.



Goods vs. Services

5. Goods-

Tangible, or touchable, objects that satisfy what you need or want

Examples: hamburgers, video game, pencils

6. Services-



Intangible actions or activities that one person performs for another *Examples: teaching, cleaning, cooking*



1. Let's see the manufacturing and service industries in action.
